

BODICE with BODIES type B

MOD-A-54



MODEL DESCRIPTION

This model is a basic with darts at the waist and hip on the front, darts at the waist on the back. The size of the darts at the waist for both the front and the back is free.

With a patterned neck, the height measurement is left free.

Set-in sleeve. The Length and Bottom Circumference measurements of the sleeve are at will.

The recess is slightly lowered.

The length of this model reaches hip height.

Attention!!! This model is created **without** fit in the Chest and Hip Circumferences, while in the Waist Circumference there is fit, this varies with the changes in the Chest and Hip Circumference measurements.

The possibility of adding cm of fit in the chest circumference and hip circumference is given.

The fit entered refers to the entire circumference and not to the individual part.

Always pay attention, after entering the measurements, that the model is harmonious.

TAKING MEASUREMENTS IS VERY IMPORTANT FOR THE CREATION OF THE MODEL.

On the MEASUREMENTS page, by selecting “**Show dummy for measurements**”, a dummy is displayed.

Selecting a box for entering measurements, for example Person Height, indicates how to correctly take this height.

Neck Height is a measurement left free and refers to the measurement of the neck at the back which determines the entire shape of the neck.

Always pay attention, after entering the measurements, that the model is harmonious.

THE MODEL IS COMPOSED OF THE FOLLOWING PARTS:

N.1 IN FRONT. Once on the fold of the fabric.

N.2 BEHIND. Once on the fold of the fabric.

N.3 SLEEVE. Once on the double fabric.

N.4 NECK. Once on the fold of the fabric.

Note:

The pattern already includes seam allowances.

MATERIAL REQUIRED FOR CREATION OF THIS MODEL

The fabric used to make the model in the photo is a cotton.

1. Fabric, type of fabric as desired, cotton, linen, viscose.
2. Quantity see next page.
3. Sewing machine thread.
4. Heat-adhesive liner, if the fabric requires it strengthen the neck.

**Being a tailor-made model, it is not possible to indicate the right one for all the materials needed amount.
You will have to measure them appropriately.**

PATTERN ON FABRIC AND QUANTITY OF FABRIC NECESSARY

There are 2 possible cases, depending on whether you are using the TittiCad Program (installed on your PC), or the Online Pattern Service (present on the website www.titticad.com):

- TittiCad program:

By opening the PRINT page and selecting the **Layout on fabric** item in the "Available Print List".

a suggestion of how to place the pattern on fabric appears.

- [Online paper patterns from www.titticad.com](http://www.titticad.com):

After entering the measurements and requesting the Free Preview, the **Arrangement on fabric and required fabric length is shown at the bottom of the page.**

The vertical arrow indicates the quantity of fabric needed, while the horizontal arrow indicates the width of the fabric, it can be double fabric (when 75cm is indicated) or single fabric (when 150cm is indicated).

It is recommended to always take a little more (10-15 cm)
